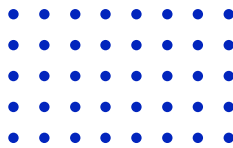

Making sure we are educating children to be happy, independent and confident in not just their learning but themselves, giving them the best possible start to life ensuring they can succeed in their next steps.

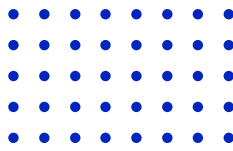
Which book, TV show or film do you recommend to everyone?
